For God's Spirit shines upon us, giving light for our darkness. Blessed be the Lord God of Israel!



Light four candles to watch for Messiah: let the light banish darkness.


He is coming, tell the glad tidings. Let your lights be shining!



OFFERING PRAYER



Let us pray the prayer Christ himself taught us:


THE LORD'S PRAYER

MEDITATIVE MUSIC


