# SPIRITUAL LIFE

## **Spiritual remembrances in February:**

Presentation of Our Lord. Sunday, February 2, 2025 - Forty days after the birth of Jesus we mark the day Mary and Joseph presented him in the temple in accordance with Jewish law. There they were greeted by Simeon, an aged priest who offered the song "Lord, now you let your servant depart in peace," as well as by the prophet Anna, who spoke of the redemption of Israel.

Ansgar, Bishop of Hamburg, missionary to Denmark and Sweden, died 865. Monday, February 3, 2025 - A monk who helped bring Christianity to Scandinavia, Ansgar returned to Germany where he was named bishop of Hamburg. He is remembered for his love for poor people.

The Martyrs of Japan, died 1597. Wednesday, February 5, 2025 - Christianity was brought to Japan in the sixteenth century by Jesuit and Franciscan missionaries. The religion was suppressed, however, and in 1597 twenty-six missionaries and converts were crucified. Nevertheless, Christianity survived and later prospered.

Cyril, monk, died 869; Methodius, bishop, died 885; missionaries to the Slavs. Friday, February 14, 2025

- These two brothers from Thessalonika, Greece, were monks and were sent to bring Christianity to the Slavic people. In the course of their work they created a written language, inventing the Cyrillic alphabet for it, and translated the Bible and the liturgy.

Martin Luther, renewer of the church, died 1546. Tuesday, February 18, 2025 - Though he began his adult church life as a simple Augustinian monk, Luther challenged the abuses he saw in the church, and his work eventually led to the Protestant Reformation. Luther's accomplishments included liturgical reform, translation of the Bible, and creation of the Small and Large Catechisms.

Polycarp, Bishop of Smyrna, martyr, died 156. Sunday, February 23, 2025 - Because he is said to have been known by John, the author of Revelation, as well as the important early church fathers Irenaeus and Ignatius, Polycarp serves as a vital link in church history. He was burned at the stake at age 86 for refusing to renounce his faith.

Elizabeth Fedde, deaconess, died 1921. Tuesday, February 25, 2025 - Born in Norway and trained there as a deaconess, Fedde was asked to come and minister to the poor and to seamen in New York City. She established the Deaconess House in Brooklyn as well as Deaconess Hospital in Minneapolis.

George Herbert, hymnwriter, died 1633. Saturday, March 1, 2025 - An excellent scholar, Herbert served briefly in the English parliament, then became a parish priest. He was known for devoted care of his parishioners, as well as for writing poetry and hymns, including "Come, my way, my truth, my life." He died at age 40.

#### LENT SERVICES

Lent is a significant season in the Christian liturgical calendar, observed by many denominations, including Roman Catholics, Anglicans, Lutherans, and Methodists. It is a period of 40 days of fasting, prayer, and penance, beginning on Ash Wednesday and culminating on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter Sunday.

The 40-day period symbolizes the time Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness, enduring temptation by Satan. The themes of repentance, sacrifice, and renewal are central to this sacred time, encouraging believers to deepen their faith and seek spiritual growth.

Our Lenten series this year invites us to explore the theme of salvation through the five senses. Each week, we will focus on a different sense, reflecting on how touch, taste, smell, sight, and hearing can bring us closer to the divine.

Join us for a transformative journey this Lent. The **Ash Wednesday** service is celebrated on **March 5 at 5:00 PM**. Lent services will be March 12, 19, 26, April 2 & 9 **from 5:45 PM to 6:15 PM**. Preceding the Lent services will be soup & sandwich starting at 5:00PM with the exception of April 2.



The time has come to replace our existing sign for our church with a new electronic sign.



# THE HOLY LAND CHRISTIANS ARE GOING TO BE OUR GUESTS HEAR THEIR STORY AND SEE THEIR BEAUTIFUL OLIVEWOOD CRAFTS

On March 30, 2025, and during the service, we will be hearing about the Christians of the Holy Land, and after the service in the church Narthex we will be hosting a nice display of handmade olive wood religious articles from Bethlehem available for purchase. These carvings include olivewood Nativity sets, crosses, Christmas ornaments, candle holders, angels and many other religious crafts that could make a nice wedding, baptism, confirmation, Easter and Christmas gifts. The carvings are handmade by Christian families from Bethlehem who rely on it for their daily bread.

More than 70% of the Christian Community in the Holy Land depend upon tourism as their only source of income.

For decades those Christians have been enduring many hardships as tourism in Bethlehem has plummeted and access to other sources of income has been sharply restricted due to the ongoing conflict, the wars, the 12 yard wall built around Bethlehem, the COVID-19 pandemic, and nowadays the catastrophic ongoing war, due to this tourists are afraid and unable to visit the Holy Land. This made it very difficult for the Christian families to find their daily bread and forced them to immigrate and flee their homeland since they lost their source of income. The Christian population of the Holy Land was 30% in the last century, today it is less than 1%. If it continues like this, in few years we will find no Christians in the land of Christ, which could cause tragic consequences to our faith and holy sites.

Please help support our Christian brothers and sisters in the town of Bethlehem where Christ was born by purchasing their carvings.

A Christian family from Bethlehem will be telling us the story of the Christians of the Holy Land and they will be presenting these carvings after the services.

It is never too late to help. All proceeds go to support Christian families from Bethlehem.

Let us carefully tend to our roots, Christian children of God in the Holy Land. And let us pray together for peace in the land where our Savior once walked to tell the world the good news of salvation.


